

Palmetto Connect

- Palmetto Connect is PCC's Digital Literacy Program.
- Mission is to help close the digital divide for residents in rural and underserved areas of SC by increasing internet access and affordability, digital literacy trainings, and connecting individuals to quality-of-life resources such as telehealth through digital inclusion.





Digital Literacy Classes

- Palmetto Connect has provided classes in 15 counties since launching.
- Senior pilot project/ Social Isolation Pilot
- Family Solutions
- Refresher classes
- Call Center





Palmetto Connect Online Modules

- PCC has developed our own set of online digital literacy modules.
- Modules are available to those who cannot attend class in person and previous participants.
- Module subjects currently include...
 - Telehealth, Laptop Basics, Email Basics, Internet Safety, Healthcare Literacy, and Zoom.





Digital Navigator

- Palmetto Connect's Digital Navigator Program was established in Oct. 2022.
- Digital Navigator: A trusted guide who assist community members in internet adoption and the use of devices.
- Assists participants with Lifeline/ Affordable Connectivity education and application, class follow-up calls, and locating an internet provider.





Affordable Connectivity Program

- FCC program that helps individuals/ families struggling to afford internet service.
- Also known as ACP.
- 1 benefit per household.
- Up to \$30 off of monthly internet for eligible households.
- As part of our trainings, participants are provided education regarding Lifeline and ACP and application support.





ACP Qualifications

- SNAP (food stamps)
- Medicaid
- Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing
- Veterans and Survivors Benefit
- Pell Grant Recipient
- Free & Reduced-Price Lunch/ Breakfast program
- Community Eligibility Provision School (CEP)
- Income at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Level





Digital Navigator Work

- Host in person enrollment events with FCC and other partners such as Office on Aging.
- Digital Navigator Training with LDEC partners- In-person and virtual.
- Resource Guide developed for all counties: includes free Wi-Fi locations, ISPs, ACP info and where to purchase devices.
- Other ACP resources available on PCC's website.



Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)

- ACP funding scheduled to run out Spring 2024
- Biden Administration requested \$6B to fund through Dec 2024
- January & February 2024 are critical
- ACP popular program 21 million households enrolled, 4 million seniors, 800,000 veterans
- FCC two step funding scenario notice to ISP, enrollees





2024: What's Next from National Stage

ACP Funding Extended:

- Continue ACP outreach and awareness work and build toward another national Week of Action in Spring 2024
- Provide training and support around additional topics like recertification and helping community members stack their benefits with Lifeline

ACP Funding Not Extended:

- Shift to supporting organizations as they help consumers transition out of ACP and on to other low-cost plans.
- Help identify opportunities for schools to make use of other funding sources to support student connectivity
- Work with coalition members to push for state-based solutions where possible.
