Connecting to the Internet

- The patient must have an internet enabled device.
- Is the patient familiar with Wi-Fi versus mobile data?
- Check Wi-Fi > Will the patient be using the mobile network [device's data], or does the patient need to connect to the internet?
- Go to the device's Settings app
- Choose Wi-Fi on:



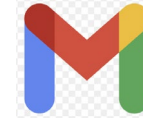
Wi-Fi off:



Finding the Telehealth Appointment Invitation

- **Email**

- Free email accounts: Outlook, Yahoo Mail, Gmail...]



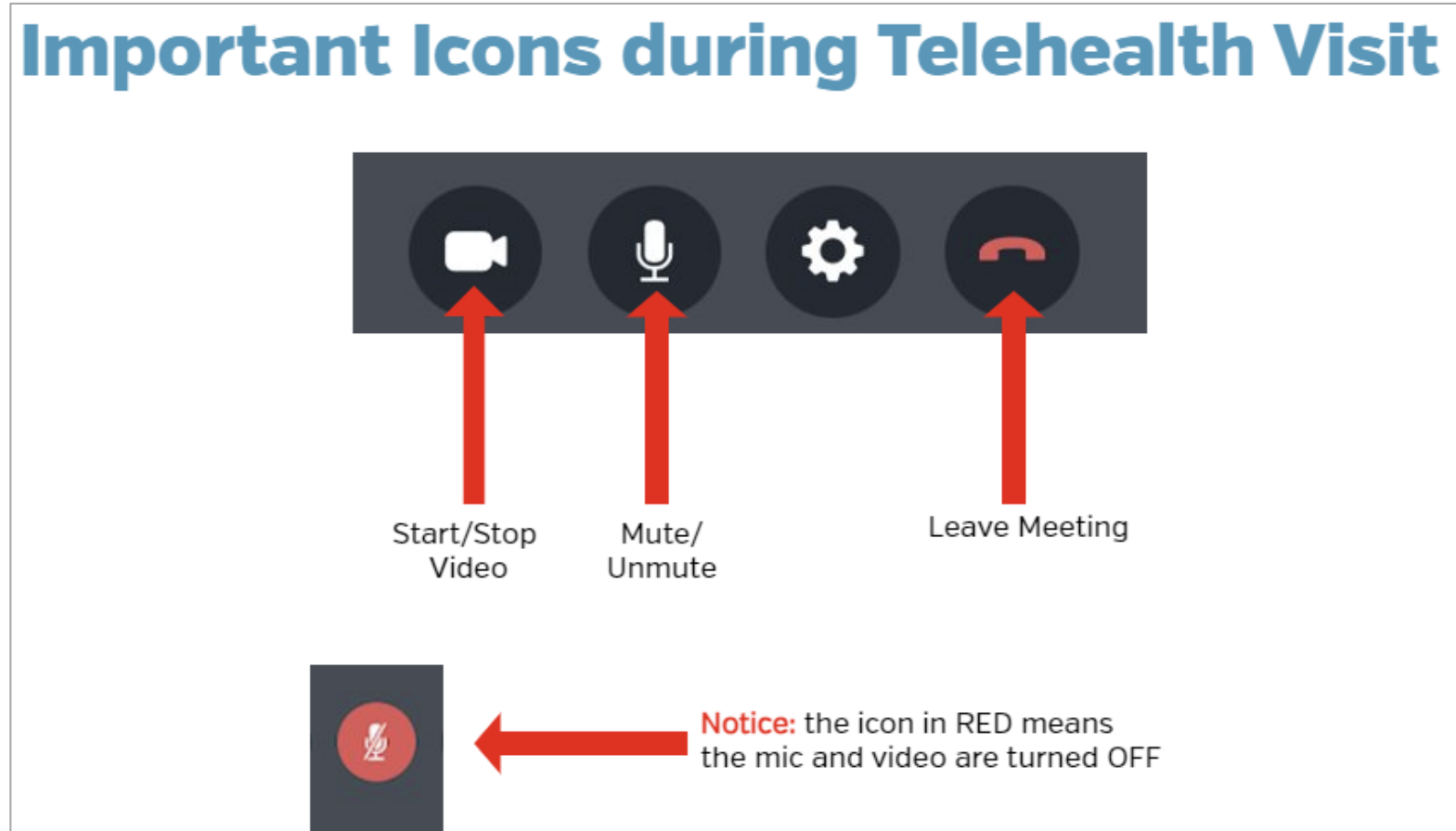
- **Text**

- [Will the invitation come by text message, or will your office call the patient?]

- **Phone call**

Important Icons During a Telehealth Visit


The icons should NOT have a line through them to ensure the camera and microphone are on.




Telehealth Etiquette


Remind your patient of the online etiquette during a telehealth visit: no distractions, good lighting, in front of the camera







Great Lighting, No Distractions
and camera can clearly see your face.







Distractions






Too dark





Camera not
pointed correctly



To prepare for your telehealth visit make sure you are sitting in a well-lit area, with limited background noise and distractions. Also make sure your camera is showing your complete face and not pointed at an odd angle.
