

A MESSAGE FROM OUR LEVALD ERS HIP

Rural and underserved. Health Professional Shortage Areas. Medically Underserved Areas. Miles traveled. Time unrecovered. Missed appointments. Hospitals closing. Health Disparities. Millions of dollars lost.

South Carolina is home to more than 5 million people. It is filled with beaches, football, dirt roads, and opportunities. I was raised in a small town with less than 800 people. When I got married, I found myself in another small town that witnessed its hospital close about 15 years ago. Around this time, several leaders embarked on a journey to create Palmetto Care Connections (PCC) to increase access to care through telehealth utilization. Since 2010, PCC has provided telehealth education, training, and technical assistance to many healthcare providers across the great state of South Carolina. With our office located in Bamberg, we are proud to serve as a voice for rural and underserved communities to advocate for resources to promote health access.

In 2015, PCC became the broadband consortium leader for South Carolina helping healthcare providers save \$72.2 Million. In this role, PCC can ensure the proper infrastructure is in place for telehealth adoption while saving millions of dollars for eligible entities such as rural health clinics, federally qualified health clinics, skill nursing facilities, and more.

In 2021, PCC expanded its reach to the patient community by launching Palmetto Connect, digital literacy trainings for South Carolina residents. More than 1,700 SC residents in 43 counties have completed the Palmetto Connect digital literacy training (including a telehealth mock visit).

Our team is so blessed to be a part of a movement dedicated to taking innovative steps to connect the unconnected. While we have made tremendous strides, there is still more work to be done. We could not have achieved so much without the support of our Board, Partners, SC Legislature, Stakeholders, Grant Funders, and Sponsors. Inside this report, you will see the impact Palmetto Care Connections has on digital and health transformation in South Carolina.




LEGISLATIVE RECEPTION



SCTA

The South Carolina Telehealth Alliance (SCTA) is a statewide collaboration of many organizations leading the way to expand telehealth services in South Carolina. The SCTA Advisory Council is co-chaired by James McElligott, MD, MSCR, Executive Medical Director of the Center for Telehealth, Medical University of South Carolina and Kathy Schwarting, MHA, Chief Executive Officer, Palmetto Care Connections.



SERVICE EXTENSION

Objective: All citizens of South Carolina will have equitable access to ambulatory care. Telehealth modalities will be used in the ambulatory setting to extend the reach of services that would otherwise be limited by travel and related barriers to care.

HOSPITALS SUPPORT

Objective: Every community hospital in our state will have access to telehealth partnerships that enhance its services and its finances.

These Hospital Services represent partnerships that extend care between hospitals using telehealth with a focus of connecting resources from larger urban hospitals to community hospitals throughout the state.

CONVENIENT CARE

Objective: All citizens in South Carolina will have affordable and immediately available patient-initiated virtual urgent and other health system-entry level care from an in-state provider.

Convenient Care services are designed to engage individual patients through their own available devices in order to optimize utilization and maximize healthcare engagement.

PRIMARY CARE SUPPORT

Objective: All primary care clinics in the state, with emphasis on Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs), will have access to integrated services through telehealth partnerships.

These services are intended to support the mission of the primary care clinic as a medical home, emphasizing the importance of local health care infrastructure while mitigating gaps in access to supporting resources.

HEALTH EQUITY

Objective: Targeted, novel initiatives will close the gap in access to health care services for high-priority health disparities.

Health Equity services will progress towards achieving health equity across the state in specifically identified areas of health disparity.



TELEHEALTH SUCCESSISTIO RY



While at school, Joshua, a high school junior, began experiencing discomfort in his toe. It was noticeably red and showing signs of infection. The school nurse contacted his mother, who tried to schedule an appointment with Joshua's podiatrist, only to find out the doctor would be out of the office for a week. At that point, the school nurse suggested a school-based telehealth visit. Both Joshua and his mother agreed to use telehealth. In less than an hour, Joshua was evaluated by a healthcare provider and prescribed an antibiotic.



TELEHEALTH ACCESS POINTS

Connecting Communities to Health, Education, Jobs, Church, Family, and More

Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Rural Health Network Development grant provided \$900,000 in federal funding over 4 years to develop a Virtual Access Telehealth Network allowing our team to expand health care access for rural residents. This funding allowed PCC to establish telehealth access points in community centers where residents tend to congregate such as churches, libraries, schools, and more.

South Carolina Department on Aging has been proud to partner with Palmetto Care Connections over the past few years. This collaboration has helped us achieve our goal of connecting rural and underserved seniors in South Carolina to quality healthcare services through broadband and telehealth initiatives. Kathy and her team are deeply

committed to their mission, and they have significantly impacted the lives of many older adults by providing them with opportunities to access quality healthcare.



TELEHEALTH SUCCESSISTORY

Since 2017, Mrs. Bamberg struggled to control her Type 2 Diabetes. However, in September 2024, she achieved her A1c goal of <7 with the help of a Chronic Care Management (CCM) team and Palmetto Care Connections' Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) programs. Through her dedication and support from her care team, she's also maintained normal blood pressure and lost 12 pounds.

Mrs. Bamberg stays connected with her CCM team monthly and participates in the RPM program, tracking her blood pressure, heart rate, blood sugar, and weight. She regularly communicates with her RPM nurse, Kamryn, for feedback and guidance.

This close communication has been key to her success. She credits her team with improving her quality of life, helping her manage medications, and providing support she wouldn't have otherwise. Her motivation comes from a deep sense of responsibility to care for her sick husband, inspiring her to stay healthy. Family and friends admire her progress, and she believes consistent effort truly makes a difference.


Mrs. Bamberg's story underscores the importance of connection and support in managing chronic conditions, inspiring others to take control of their health.




BROADBAND SAVINGS



Palmetto Care Connections provides digital literacy training, digital devices, assistance with accessing affordable internet solutions, online content, and technical support. Launched in 2021, PCC has hosted 55 classes providing training to 2,753 individuals in the community (1,719) and corporate (1,034) settings.

Palmetto Care Connections received funding from the SC Department of Health and Human Services to increase digital and health literacy to Medicaid recipients in South Carolina. This partnership supports the state's ongoing efforts to reduce healthcare disparities and improve overall health outcomes.

CLOSING THE D G TALD V DE

In collaboration with Family Solutions, a program of the SC Office of Rural Health, and with funding from Absolute Total Care, PCC provided digital and health literacy training to pregnant women to improve maternal health in South Carolina. Each participant who completed the online training received a free tablet and 12 months of internet service at no cost. The training consisted of learning how to navigate online patient portals, research medical information, and conduct a telehealth visit, all while practicing internet safety.

Latasha King, a mother, community health worker, and student, embraced digital learning through PCC's digital literacy class. What started as a requirement to receive a free tablet quickly became a game-changer.

"We had to take the course to get the tablet, but learning how to be digitally literate was incredibly helpful," Latasha shared. The step-by-step instruction ensured everyone, regardless of experience, could confidently

For Latasha, mastering basic tablet functions was essential—not just for herself but for her community, including older adults and individuals with cognitive challenges. Her daughter, now two, also benefited from the tablet, using it for learning and telehealth appointments.

Beyond personal use, Latasha applied her skills in the workforce and with her clients, recognizing technology's power in overcoming healthcare barriers. "I've had clients use it for telehealth, which was a huge help for those with transportation challenges," she explained.

Latasha's journey highlights the impact of digital education in fostering confidence, accessibility, and empowerment. Thanks to PCC, she and her community are thriving in the digital age.
