





1. Will my insurance cover telehealth?

In South Carolina, both Medicaid and Medicare cover telehealth visits. Some private insurers such as Blue Cross Blue Shield of SC and United Healthcare provide coverage for telehealth visits as well. Check with your insurance company to confirm coverage before scheduling a telehealth visit.

2. What technology and equipment do I need to have a telehealth visit?

Digital devices with a camera and microphone such as a smartphone, laptop, or tablet can be used for a telehealth visit.
