



Breast cancer originates in the cells of the breast. Without early detection and treatment, these cancer cells can spread (metastasize) to other areas of the body. There are multiple types and stages of breast cancer.






Prevention, Diagnosis & Treatment




Please remember to have a mammogram yearly and perform a monthly breast self-examination. If you notice any abnormalities during self-examination it is important to follow up with your primary care provider right away. Early detection and treatment is crucial.

Protect & Take Care of Yourself

A self-examination of your breast should be performed once a month, ideally on the same day each month. For example, the 1st of every month. Use the pads of your three middle fingers for the recommended palpation technique.

Nipple Discharge










Persistent Breast Itching
